































Advisory on the Integration of AI in Education



On Friday, the 10th of October, our school had the privilege of hosting an informative session on Artificial Intelligence conducted by Mr. Sarat Chandra Pyreddy, an expert in technology and innovation. The goal of this session was to familiarize students with the fast and developing field of artificial intelligence (AI), including its advantages, disadvantages, and responsible use, while also emphasizing how it is influencing our present and future. Mr. Sarat Chandra began by explaining what AI truly means- machines designed to simulate human intelligence and assist in tasks such as problem solving, communication and creativity. He emphasized how AI is already transforming industries and other sectors from healthcare and education to entertainment and environmental sustainability.


Students were interested to learn about how AI can personalize learning experiences and even assist in addressing global challenges like climate change. The discussion did, however, also highlight AI's drawbacks and ethical issues. Mr. Sarat Chandra explained to us that while AI is powerful, it depends entirely on the data it is fed. He discussed the importance of human judgment and the potential risks of over reliance on technology which can lead us to be inefficient. Students were also guided on how to use AI responsibly and effectively.

Sarat Chandra Sir encouraged us to treat AI as a tool for learning and creativity, not as a shortcut to avoid effort. He emphasized the need for critical thinking and understanding that AI can provide guidance, but the ideas and originality must always come from the learner.

This interactive session concluded with a question and answer session, where students asked thoughtful questions about Al's future role in careers, ethics, and innovation. It was an eye opening and informative experience that left everyone inspired to explore Al with curiosity, responsibility, and integrity




